Fiscal year beginning in August is good; Track expenses and income; Budget requests over \$x must be approved with the exception of the annual meeting budget \$x with expectation of repayment; student sub unit given \$x for travel; annual meeting VP funds for travel (important for representation and to establish Quorum); student travel officer to attend meetings; ExCom distribute news letter to nonmembers; Regular fees may be assessed; Regular Fees may be waived; Money for ExCom meeting lunches
